

PUBLIC WORKS COMMITTEE  
POLICE & FIRE COMMITTEE  
APRIL 26, 2007

Present: Mayor Liechty, Council Members Schulz, Heinrich, Grabinger and Parisien, Horgan, Donegan, Sveum and Fuchs. Absent: Dalsted.

Discussion was held relating to extending the two hour parking restriction downtown to include 2nd & 3rd Streets SE east to 4th Ave SE and 3rd Ave SE from 1st St SE to 4th St SE except for ½ hour parking in front of City Hall.

Police Chief Donegan stated that need for restrictions are not present at this time.

Heinrich moved to table the extension of parking restrictions downtown indefinitely. Seconded by Schulz. Voice vote showed: 4 ayes (Schulz, Heinrich, Grabinger and Parisien), 1 nay (Liechty). Carried.

Mary Kuhn appeared before the committee requesting sidewalk on the north side of Business Loop West.

The City Engineer and City Administrator will check with John Thompson, NDDOT, relative to this sidewalk request, and report back to the May committee meeting.

Grabinger moved to recommend that the City Council approve and appropriate funds up to \$250.00 to the Jamestown Middle School for a storm drain stenciling project. Seconded by Heinrich. Unanimous aye vote. Carried.

Schulz moved to recommend that the City Council award the bid for 2007 Sidewalk, Curb & Gutter District #07-11 to Lindberg Brothers, Inc., in the amount of \$72,002.50. Seconded by Heinrich. Unanimous aye vote. Carried.

Grabinger moved to recommend that the City Council award the bid for Seal Coat, Patching, Construction and Reconstruction District #07-41 to Border States Paving, Inc., in the amount of \$1,448,680.60. Seconded by Parisien. Unanimous aye vote. Carried.

Heinrich moved to recommend that the City Council accept the proposal from MVTL for 2007 Groundwater Quality Assessment for the Jamestown Sanitary Landfill, in the amount of \$8,030.00. Seconded by Schulz. Unanimous aye vote. Carried.

Parisien moved to recommend that the City Council accept the proposal from CPS, Ltd., for 2007 Annual Groundwater Monitoring Report for the Jamestown Sanitary Landfill, in the amount of \$12,516.00. Seconded by Heinrich. Unanimous aye vote. Carried.

Schulz moved to recommend that the City Council enter into a Cost Participation & Maintenance Agreement Amendment from the ND Department of Transportation relating to the Jamestown US 281 Project No. HPU-2-281(030)066. Seconded by Heinrich. Unanimous aye vote. Carried.

Schulz moved to place on the City Council agenda, without recommendation, in order to allow the City Engineer and Mayor to contact the ND State Water Commission regarding the process required to get the Ice House Dam repaired. Seconded by Heinrich. Unanimous aye vote. Carried.

Randy Pope gave the Committee an update on the City Well Replacement project.

Heinrich moved to place on the City Council agenda, without recommendation, the Adopt a Highway Project. Seconded by Schulz. Unanimous aye vote. Carried.

Liechty reported she had received an inquiry from a citizen relative to a parallel water and sewer line adjacent to an 8' box storm sewer culvert on the US 281 Reconstruction Project.

Heinrich moved that no further action be taken relative to the concern expressed by a citizen regarding the parallel water and sewer line adjacent to the 8' box culvert on the US 281 Reconstruction Project No. HPU-2-281(030)066. Seconded by Parisien. Voice vote showed: 4 ayes (Schulz, Heinrich, Grabinger and Parisien), 1 nay (Liechty). Carried.
