PUBLIC WORKS COMMITTEE  
MAY 24, 2007

Present: Mayor Liechty, Council Members Schulz, Grabinger and Parisien, City Attorney Dalsted, Horgan, Donegan, Weight, Sad, Snyder, Suko, Quam, Sveum and Fuchs. Absent: Council Member Heinrich.

The second reading of Ordinance No. 1322, pertaining to sampling of malt beverages in an off-sale establishment is scheduled for the June 4, 2007, City Council meeting.

Chief Donegan will meet with the Mayor's Committee for Employment of People with Disabilities to discuss the information presented by the City Engineer relative to the Feasibility of installing sidewalk on the north side of Business Loop West between 4th Avenue SW and the 10th Street Bridge. He will have them research any possible grant funding for this project.

Liechty moved to have the Police Chief further explore the possibilities, and gather additional information, relative to grant funds available for placing a School Resource Officer within the Jamestown School District. Seconded by Parisien. Unanimous aye vote. Carried.

Grabinger moved to have the City Attorney and City Engineer draft a license agreement to allow John Kukowski, 1106 7th Avenue SW to construct a storm drain system from his property to a City storm drain. Seconded by Liechty. Unanimous aye vote. Carried.

Grabinger moved to recommend the City Council approve Change Orders No. 1, 2 and 4, to Northern Improvement Company, for the US 281 Highway Reconstruction Project No. AC-HPU-NHU-2-281(030)066 (16th Street SW to 37th Avenue). Seconded by Parisien. Unanimous aye vote. Carried.

Randy Pope, Interstate Engineering, Inc., reported that Wells 2, 3 & 4 may be on line within the next week to ten days. The transmission line is planned to be cut in to the Water Plant on Tuesday, May 28, 2007. He also reported that the Park District has indicated that the placement of a test hole or well at the proposed Well 7 site cannot be allowed, as it would interfere with the operations of the area. Consensus of the committee was to concur with the Park District's wishes until such time as the new wells are on line and evaluated relative to water production capabilities.

Grabinger moved to recommend the City Council approve the Adopt a Roadway Program. Seconded by Parisien. Unanimous aye vote. Carried.

Liechty moved to place on the next Public Works Committee agenda, review of any regulations relative to parking in City owned parking lots. Seconded by Schulz. Unanimous aye vote. Carried.

It was reported that the City-Wide Clean-up resulted in 262 tons of refuse being picked up compared to 315 tons in 2006.

Jim Boyd from the Jamestown Regional Airport Board presented an update relative to the Jets for Jamestown Project that is currently in progress.
