

Public Works Committee
Police & Fire Committee
October 23, 2008

Present: Liechty, Parisien, Kourajian, Nygaard, Schulz, Dalsted, Reuther, Schwartzkopf, Snyder and Fuchs.

Parisien moved to recommend the City Council authorize Interstate Engineering, Inc., to perform a topographical survey of the waterway in the southwest part of the city west of US281 and south of I-94. Seconded by Schulz. Unanimous aye vote. Carried.

Liechty moved to recommend the City Council approve the request of Bloom Township for the City to place speed limit signs on 35th Street SE from east of Cavendish Foods to the east property line of the City's Sanitary Landfill, subject to receiving documentation that the Bloom Township Board has taken official action to establish the requested speed limits. Seconded by Kourajian. Unanimous aye vote. Carried.

City Engineer Schwartzkopf updated the committee on storm water improvements in the area of the Railroad Drive property. He indicated that he and Interstate Engineering, Inc., are looking at an alternative to the previously proposed improvements.

City Engineer Schwartzkopf updated the committee on the progress of the work needed on Water Well #6. He indicated that the equipment needed to resolve the overheating problems will be installed shortly at no cost to the City.

City Engineer Schwartzkopf informed the committee that he will be meeting with Stutsman County personnel following the general election to prepare recommendations for consideration on the next phase of the City Aerial Photo/GIS Project.

City Engineer Schwartzkopf informed the committee that he is working with Scherbenske & Sons, Inc., and the manufacturer of the valves for the Main Lift Station to determine the best way to proceed with the refurbishment or replacement of the faulty valves.

There were no agenda items scheduled for the Fire & Police Committee.
