

ORDINANCE NO. 1403

An ordinance amending Chapter 2 of the Code of the City of Jamestown, North Dakota, by amending Section 2-59 in order to set forth regulations concerning the use and regulation of firearms during emergencies in the City of Jamestown.

WHEREAS, the North Dakota Legislative Assembly has enacted new regulations prohibiting the restriction and use of firearms in emergencies.

WHEREAS, to comply with the new provisions the City Code of the City of Jamestown requires updating.


NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordered by the City Council of the City of Jamestown, North Dakota that Chapter 2, Section 2-59, be amended and re-enacted as follows:

Sec. 2-59. Same—Orders.

After proclamation of a civil emergency, the mayor may also, in the interest of public safety and welfare, make any or all of the following orders:


- (a) The closing of all retail liquor stores.
- (b) The closing of all taverns.
- (c) The closing of all private clubs or portions thereof wherein the consumption of intoxicating liquor or beer is permitted.
- (d) The discontinuance of the sale of beer.
- (e) The discontinuance of selling, distributing or giving away of gasoline or other liquid flammable or combustible products in any container other than a gasoline tank properly affixed to a motor vehicle.
- (f) The closing of gasoline stations and other establishments, the chief activity of which is the sale, distribution or dispensing of liquid flammable or combustible products.
- (g) The closing of any or all establishments or portions thereof, the chief activity of which is the sale, distribution, dispensing or giving away of firearms or ammunition.
- (h) Issue such other orders as are imminently necessary for the protection of life and property.
